## **GENERAL**

- 1. By Participating in the auction, buyers and sellers expressly agree to adhere to the Terms and Conditions set forth herein and to the provisions set forth in the Video Cattle Marketing Contract.
- 2. Terms and Conditions of the sale are printed in sale catalog; however, announcements from the auction block take precedence over printed material.
- 3. All buyers and sellers who are not present at auction but who participate in the auction by any means shall be deemed to have authorized United Producers, Inc. to sign the Video Cattle Marketing Contract on their behalf.
- 4. Cattle are graded and identified as to breed, muscle score, frame size and flesh.
- 5. Cattle are available for viewing the week of the sale. Buyers wanting to see any lots should call United Producers, Inc. to schedule.

## PRICE SLIDE

Based on advice from USDA Market News Service and/or U.T. Extension, the recommended price slide will be listed on each lot sold. Every effort has been made to give our best estimate on all weights.

Unless otherwise stated in individual lot sale conditions, Cattle 50 pounds or less over base weight will slide heavy side only at listed price slide.

Cattle will have a 50 lbs. weight stop unless otherwise noted.

## WEIGHTS AND WEIGHING INFO

- 1. All weights given are best estimates as determined by United Producers, Inc. personnel, and consignor. Every effort has been made to be accurate; however, no guarantee is offered on the estimated weight or range.
- 2. A 36 HOUR NOTICE IS REQUIRED FROM BUYER TO UNITED PRODUCERS, INC. TO LOAD CATTLE. Cattle will be delivered per weighing conditions described in the catalog for each lot. Sellers will deliver all cattle consigned unless prevented from doing so by reasons beyond their control.
- 3. Unless otherwise stated or negotiated, Cattle must be picked up within 10 days of the sale date. Sundays are not available for delivery. All scheduled weighings are to be arranged through United Producers, Inc. with proper notice.
- 4. Cattle will be weighed and loaded by United Producers, Inc. employees or representatives. United Producers, Inc. will cut out any blemished or unmerchantable cattle with agreement of buyer and seller. Cattle will be weighed when all consigned cattle are at the scales or per catalog write-up if different.

## OPEN HEIFERS

Unless otherwise provided in writing, heifers sold are not guaranteed open.

## PREGNANCY CHECKING OF HEIFERS

Sellers may, at their discretion, allow a buyer to have the heifers they are purchasing pregnancy checked. If heifers are pregnancy checked, they must be checked at the Seller's Farm or at one of UPI's shipment facilities. Otherwise, buyer accepts heifers "as is".

## NO SALES

Seller reserves the right to reject bids. In the event of a "NO SALE," the last bidder will be paid \$1.00 (one dollar) per head by the marketing agency, and the seller will be charged a fee of \$3.00 (three dollars) per head.

## BINDER FEE

United Producers, Inc. retains the authority to charge the buyer a binder fee of up to \$50.00 per head for each lot bought and to apply toward purchase of said lot, due upon request by United Producers, Inc. Buyers present at sale may pay this fee at the close of sale. Others may pay this fee within 3 days of the applicable sale date. A failure to pay the required binder fee will be considered a default.

## **SETTLEMENT**

All sales are due and payable immediately upon weighing of livestock and receipt of invoice. It is further expressly intended, understood, and agreed that this is a cash transaction.

## TITLE AND LIABILITY

- 1. Title and ownership of the cattle do not transfer to buyer, notwithstanding delivery or possession, until the purchase price is paid in full and all funds are collected.
- 2. Liability for loss of the cattle transfers to buyer at the time cattle are weighed or loaded onto truck whichever occurs first.

## WARRANTIES

The parties expressly agree that there are no warranties express or implied on any cattle listed or sold. All cattle are sold "as is."

## **DEFAULT**

In case of failure to perform any term or condition in the agreement by either buyer or seller, the defaulting party shall be liable for actual and incidental damages as permitted by law, plus court costs and reasonable attorney fees, as well as any other available relief. Default in payment shall include: 1.) Failure to receive full and final payment; 2.) Default of instrument given in payment; 3.) Death, bankruptcy or insolvency of buyer. Upon default, United Producers, Inc., with or without notice, may impose all rights afforded by law. The laws of the State of Tennessee shall govern.

## **COMMISSION & BEEF CHECKOFF**

Seller's Commission and Marketing fees are established by Lower Middle Tennessee Cattle Association in conjunction with United Producers, Inc. and will be charged on each lot. Additionally, \$1.00 per head will be deducted from seller for National Beef Checkoff and \$.50 per head for Tennessee State Beef Checkoff. (TN Beef Checkoff is a volunteer checkoff. All markets are required by law to deduct. A refund option is available through the Tennessee Department of Agriculture.)

## **INSURANCE**

Livestock Insurance on all sold livestock will be deducted from seller's proceeds at an established rate by the carrier to cover accidental death or injury at time of weigh up and load out.

## ANIMAL DISEASE TRACEABILITY LAWS

Beginning January 1, 2015, all livestock moved out of the state of origin must be accompanied by a Certificate of Health Inspection from an accredited veterinarian. It shall be the **Buyer's responsibility** to furnish necessary information at least 3 days prior to weigh up in order to obtain a certificate from the Seller. It shall then be the **Seller's responsibility** to provide the certificate or the information necessary to secure a certificate from the veterinarian.







## DOSAGE AND ADMINISTRATION

LONGRANGE® (eprinomectin) should be given only by subcutaneous injection in front of the shoulder at the recommended dosage level of 1 mg eprinomectin per kg body weight (1 mL per 110 lb body weight). Each mL of LONGRANGE contains 50 mg of eprinomectin, sufficient to treat 110 lb (50 kg) body weight. Divide doses greater than 10 mL between two injection sites to reduce occasional discomfort or site reaction.

Do not underdose. Ensure each animal receives a complete dose based on a current body weight. Underdosing may result in ineffective treatment, and encourage the development of parasite resistance.
